Work will begin on the west side of N. Manning Avenue and extend approximately 400 feet west through back yards.

This project is designed to increase stormwater conveyance capacity, and improve drainage in the area.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

KC Water covers 320 square miles of Kansas City with an intricate network of water, wastewater and stormwater systems, including 630 miles of storm sewers, 53,000 stormwater inlets, and 15 stormwater pumps stations. Some of that infrastructure needs to be updated.

This project was requested through the Public Improvement Advisory Committee (PIAC) process. Residents request and the committee recommends citywide and capital improvement projects. Eligible PIAC projects include stormwater drainage and flooding problems.
