# INFLOW & INFILTRATION (I/I) REDUCTION: BRUSH CREEK AREA 2

**CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULED FOR:** MARCH 2018 - SEPTEMBER 2019

The City of Kansas City, Missouri is working to construct important improvements to the wastewater system in your neighborhood. This project will rehabilitate aging sewers in your area to like-new conditions. The work will include restoration of sewer mains, service lateral connections and manholes. When complete, the project will improve service reliability, and lessen the frequency of sewer overflows and basement backups.

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#### WHAT'S BEING DONE?

The scope of work to be provided under this construction contract will include:

- Rehabilitation of approximately 46,000 linear feet of sewer mains ranging in size from 8 inches to 24 inches.
- Rehabilitation of approximately 890 linear feet of service lateral connections.
- Rehabilitation of approximately 2,600 vertical feet of manholes.
- Replacement frames and covers for approximately 260 manholes.

#### WHAT'S THE TIMELINE?

Construction is anticipated to begin in March 2018 and will be completed by September 2019.

#### WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT?

We appreciate your patience and support as we work to complete this important community infrastructure project. Customers will be notified in advance of pending disruptions, which may include:

- Temporary street closures
- · Restoration of curbs, sidewalks, streets and driveways
- Large equipment creating noise and dusty conditions
- Temporary sewer service disruption

#### WHO'S DOING THE WORK?

The City of Kansas City, Missouri will be assisted by Blue Nile Contractors.

#### WHAT'S THE CONTRACT AMOUNT?

The budget for construction is \$7,070,984.

#### WHAT'S THE "CONSENT DECREE"?

In 2010, the City of Kansas City, Missouri entered into a Consent Decree with the United States Environmental Protection Agency to reduce the volume and frequency of overflows from the City's sewer system. Kansas City's Smart Sewer program is a 25-year plan to address this challenge. The Brush Creek Area 2 Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) Reduction Project is one piece of the Smart Sewer program and is required by the Consent Decree to be completed by December 31, 2020.
